It gives us immense pleasure to welcome all of you to this new academic year. We hope our children have rested and enjoyed their vacation and are ready to begin their academic journey.

When the current pandemic struck us early this year, school had to be discontinued suddenly; we quickly adapted to the change and commenced virtual schooling. This continued in the month of April. Our teachers did an admirable job of stepping up to learn new ways of teaching and ensured the academic continuity for the students. They have managed both their home and professional fronts successfully and continued to attend trainings and plan lessons through the summer vacation as well, so that they are well prepared to commence teaching from 8th June. We appreciate their commitment and dedication.

Students too were quick to learn this new way of education. We are so proud of all of our students for their dedication and efforts for continuing their school work during these challenging times. We would also like to thank you, the parents for supporting the students through this transition to remote learning. You have always been a strong pillar in the learning journey of the students. We are aware that despite the additional pressures of working *from* home and working *for* home during this time, many of you have taken the time to support your children. You have been doing a commendable job in managing this situation!
